



In fact, it consists of three flags: the Scottish, the Irish and the English




SCOTLAND (St. Andrew's white cross on blue) IRELAND (St. Patrick's red cross on white) ENGLAND (St. George's red cross on white) The Union Flag underwent a gradual development. The first one was created in 1606, when England and Scotland were united under the wish of Queen Elizabeth I and on the order of King James I






With King James I inheritance of the English throne

the Cross of Saint George the patron saint of **England was placed** over the Scottish **Cross of Saint Andrew** the patron saint of Scotland to form the **British Union** Flag



All seagoing ships began using the new Union flag better known today as the **Union Jack**



The final version of the Union Flag

appeared in 1801, following the union of Great **Britain with** Ireland, with inclusion of the cross of St. **Patrick**
